

# Hawke's Bay Farm Forester

Omakere District Field Day Saturday 23 November



Hawke's Bay's Omakere District has a rich and colourful history. The area is perhaps best known for its remote beach holiday spots and big coastal sheep stations. However much of the district actually falls into the Tukituki Catchment, which extends to within 3km of the coast at its closest point.

Join us for a tiki-tour of Omakere, taking in some well known historic landmarks, as well as some recent planting projects and initiatives. Highlights will include:

- The early stages of a community riparian restoration project on the Mangamahake Stream.
- A remnant Kahikatea stand on Amblethorn Station
- The historic Aramoana Station woolshed - a Category 2 listed heritage building and headquarters of the Aramoana Environmental & Education Charitable Trust
- Coastal forest restoration overlooking the Te Angiangi Marine Reserve
